## To Dos

- > Visit your dentist, eye doctor and family physician for a complete check-up.
- > Pack a small medicine kit in consultation with your family physician for minor illnesses.
- > Make copies of all the documents and certificates you are carrying and leave a set at home.
- > Write down and keep handy important phone numbers of contacts and bank account numbers of your parents.
- Inform the Freshman Institute about your arrival date, time etc. well in advance. Email: <u>arrival@freshman-institute.de</u>. If you have applied through an agency, please contact them about possible assistance with your flight. Our Bejing office <u>beijing@fh-aachen.de</u> will advise Chinese students who organize their own flights.
- > Have a haircut before you leave as it is pretty expensive in Germany, up to 15 euros.

## Tips

- School uniforms are not required at the Freshman Institute. Jeans and t-shirts are a good choice for school. However, in winter you will need a heavy coat, pullovers and winter shoes, as temperatures will fall below freezing for some weeks during the winter (November-March). You will also need an umbrella or raincoat. The dormitories and classrooms are, however, fully centrally heated.
- > Don't forget that your parents can always forward any documents or items that you didn't bring with you at a later date.
- > The Freshman Institute will give you pillows, bed covers & bed linens to use during the Freshman year.
- > The Freshman Institute will provide you with a calculator.
- > Electric kettles, rice cookers, etc. are available in Germany for a reasonable price.
- > Kitchen articles and school supplies can be purchased cheaply in Germany.
